Do you have Culture Day in your country?








XFor NC 1/2" & 1-1/4

This tool is recommended for the stable processing of plates with protective sheets!

(Examples of problems specific to materials with protective sheets)

- 1"Slug pulling" caused by the protective sheet not being cut securely.
- ②The slug and adhesive component of the protective sheet enter the guide through the gap between the guide hole and the punch blade edge.



Advice on one point!

By making the die clearance 30%-40% narrower than normal, the cutting power of the protective sheet will be improved. However, it is recommended that you select a tool that is resistant to wear, such as M2 punches, because it is burden on the tool.
